

Alaska weather is unpredictable so prepare for the unexpected.

Dressing in layers is important for comfort.

Clothing Suggestions

- A good raincoat or waterproof wading jacket
- Polar fleece jacket or hooded sweatshirt (hooded and wind proof are best)
- Medium weight jacket
- One undershirt for each day
- 3 Shirts of varying weights that can likely be worn several times
- 3 Pair of pants
- 2 pair of long underwear (for under your waders)
- Socks for each day including boot socks if needed
- Fishing gloves (neoprene, cotton, or polar fleece)
- Hat/hats for additional sun protection
- Waterproof day pack (could be used as carry on for flight)
- One pair of chest high waders and boots (*Felt soles are banned in Alaska*)
- Camp shoes – running shoes, short boots or moccasins for after fishing wear

Miscellaneous Suggestions

- Bug spray with deet
 - Shaving kit with toiletries
 - Sunscreen / Chapstick
 - Hand cream
 - Camera and all the accessories and cords!
 - Binoculars
 - Polarized sunglasses
 - Garbage bag for dirty clothes or boots for trip home
 - Ziploc bags are nice to keep handy for waterproofing items
- The lodge does provide Waders and wading boots if needed.
- Clothing and gear should be packed into a rolling style duffel if possible.
- Valuable items should be packed in your daypack.
